- Senior Services: As a member of Programs & Services Committee (now Vice Chair) with oversight of the Senior Services Department, supported the construction of a new Newton Senior Center & opposed service cutbacks to senior rides programs; forged close ties with the Health & Humans Services Department
- Senior Finances: As a Finance Committee member, pushed for expanded local tax relief programs for low-income retirees and highlighted home maintenance cost burdens; championed emergency rental assistance to reduce pandemic evictions
- Senior Housing: Voted for new older adult housing developments
- Constituent Services: Helped many elder residents navigate city staff to straighten out problems, including making home visits to provide guidance or help connect people to city social workers


