- Housing supply: Help young adults, families, & emptynesters remain local and keep jobs in our state with 200K new homes of varying types & price points across MA by 2030; restore aging affordable housing stock.
- Housing financing: Establish a state public bank for discounted, direct lending for construction from ADUs to major projects and affordable housing developments; diversify revenue for local Affordable Housing Trusts.
- Housing stability: Keep residents (especially children) in homes they already live in when possible, by expanding right-to-counsel & foreclosure mediation pilot programs and increasing short-term emergency rental assistance.

- Housing sustainability: Incentivize rehab of existing housing to reduce teardowns; strengthen code for high-efficiency construction; concentrate new multi-family homes on previously developed land near mass transit (linking this redevelopment to a fund for transit infrastructure improvements).
- Emergency housing safety net: Invest longterm in stable, safe, & adequately equipped transitional housing to replace the costly day-byday ad hoc shelter system.


